Due to the rising global uncertainties, subnational communities will be increasingly important to national foreign policies and global connections. In many regards, this micro-level of cooperation also manages the foreign relations of the future.  
However, unequal living conditions and a rise of autocracies in world politics have putting pressure on local governments. The ongoing trench warfare in Ukraine and the increase of smaller proxy wars have driven migration to a critical peak. Authorities have to integrate more and more refugee camps into the urban public space. Participants will be confronted with making spatial decisions, mapping out options and clarifying the status of the camps and rights of refugees. At the same time, the constant threat of armed conflicts challenges security of cities and homes. Participants will have to find ways to introduce self-sufficiency and flexibility into housing, supplies and infrastructure.



## II. *Age of Global Diseases*

Several new types of diseases start spreading all over the world. Since the WHO has been dissolved in the aftermath of the COVID-19 pandemic due to the retreat of both the US and China, no global health organization monitors outbreaks of diseases anymore. Global Health lies in the hand of nations and increasingly local communities. This development sparks uncertainty and insecurity in people, who turn to radical and society-dividing movements, challenging democracy. Participants will need to develop a crisis response plan, taking into account societal and spatial measures, the consequences for public space and the meaning of home in this context, while addressing questions of accountability.
