Forced Movement. How to deal with imminent streams of migration?

On February 24th Russia launched its widely condemned attack on Ukraine. Since then, already hundreds of thousands of Ukrainians have left their homes, fleeing from war and destruction. Many of them have turned to neighbouring EU states in their search for a safe refuge and in an act of solidarity, many EU countries have opened their borders towards Ukrainians. However, migration, and especially the issue of asylum, remains a contentious topic and has created disagreement and resentment amongst EU governments. But the question remains: How can the EU deal with the crisis and can member states find a solution to an issue that has been gridlocked for more than a decade? These are the questions to be explored during the interactive workshop "Forced Movement. How to deal with imminent streams of migration?". During the workshop, participants will take on the roles of high-level EU decision-makers who have to react to the current crisis. Having only limited time to react, they must take a decision in a potentially confusing and ambiguous situation. In a reflective discussion, they will then try to find recommendations and guidelines for the challenges ahead.

From 2 to 10 April 2022, the ZEIT-Stiftung Ebelin und Gerd Bucerius, in cooperation with the Observer Research Foundation, holds its twentieth annual Bucerius Summer School on Global Governance (BSS). The original idea to create such an institution harked back to Henry Kissinger's famous International Summer Seminar at Harvard University. In the 1960s, Kissinger brought together emerging leaders from all over the world for a summer course of debates and lectures. Many of the seminar's alumni went on to become ministers, renowned academics, prominent journalists – leaders in their respective fields.

Out of this year's Bucerius Summer School candidates – nominated by government heads, ministers, company CEOs, university presidents, media leaders and directors of international organizations – we have invited 50 promising business representatives, politicians and academics from different countries all over the world – women and men between 28 and 36 years of age who have already acquired considerable professional experience.

The overall aim of the Bucerius Summer School is to foster leadership qualities in young professionals by involving them in an international dialogue on current political, economic, social and juridical questions. Participants are inspired by – and learn from – distinguished speakers, well-known public figures in politics, business, academia and the NGO sphere.

Georg Mascolo, Journalist, and Eberhard Sandschneider, Partner, Berlin Global Advisors chair the sessions of the Bucerius Summer School. The lectures and workshops will be held at the Hotel Le Méridien on the banks of the Alster and at the Kampnagel Theater in Hamburg. At Kampnagel, participants attend the ZEIT-Stiftung's EuropaCamp, a public event with lectures, panel discussions and a cultural program. Georg Mascolo, Eberhard Sandschneider, and Director Sascha Suhrke with his team are responsible for the program.

The Bucerius Summer School has always been more than just a high-profile conference. It is about building networks and enhancing cross-cultural cooperation of representatives from all walks of public life. To follow up on the annual meetings, we run

an active alumni network. With the support of the alumni, the ZEIT-Stiftung and the Observer Research Foundation organize regional follow-up seminars.

Since 1971, the **ZEIT-Stiftung Ebelin und Gerd Bucerius**, one of Germany's largest private foundations, has been involved in the funding of projects in various fields of research, art and culture, as well as education and training. The ZEIT-Stiftung was established by Gerd Bucerius, the founder and publisher of Germany's leading quality weekly, DIE ZEIT. Apart from the Bucerius Law School, the Bucerius Kunst Forum in Hamburg and other projects, the foundation runs a variety of international programs, of which the Bucerius Summer School is the most ambitious.
